

How to answer multiple choice questions—a system by Bard Keeler:
Types of Mult. Choice--

1. “Know it Question”—student knows answer—high confidence—BUT, carefully read all 5 choices though.
2. “Think I Know”---seem to remember class disc. or readings. At this point, change mind-set— Look for wrong answers—Eliminate 2—guess and move on, Don’t look back. (There is research that states most student’s first guess was correct, then of course, there are good guessers and bad guessers—Know thyself—are you a good guesser??)
3. “Might know”—eliminate easy wrong answer—asterik ** it on side and move on making sure to skip bubble space on test sheet!
4. “oh NO”—Don’t know anything—don’t waste time “x” it, move on fast. (You do NOT understand “stem” or question at all.)

Students who waste time with no. 3 or no. 4 type multiple choice miss chance to answer others correctly.

Are the last multiple choice questions harder than the first ones? NO, easiest mc could be #70. When you finish all 70 mc, Now go back to asterisk blanks. Also, other mc questions may have shook loose ideas for answers on previous questions. Maybe you can eliminate one more choice in no. 3 type mc.

Rule of 2—Don’t go back to #1 or #2 mc questions—(Know it and Think I know types).
